

# **Denomination News**

### **Bishops Call Special Session of General Conference**

The Council of Bishops announced the morning of April 25th the call to a special General Conference on Feb. 23-26, 2019, in St. Louis, Missouri. The special meeting of The United Methodist Church's top lawmaking assembly will be limited to acting on a report by Council of Bishops, based on the proposals from the Commission on the Way Forward. The 32-member commission, appointed by the bishops, has the charge of finding ways for the denomination to stay together despite differences.

### Methodists, Anglicans propose new relationship

BIRMINGHAM, England — The Methodist Church in Britain and the Church of England have published a joint report, "Mission and Ministry in Covenant," which proposes that presbyters from each denomination be eligible to serve in the other and that the Methodist Church recognize the office of a president-bishop.

### Judicial Council Meets—excerpted from UMNS

The Western Jurisdiction College of Bishops filed a motion asking the United Methodist Judicial Council to reconsider its ruling in the case of a gay bishop.

Part of the court's ruling in Decision 1341 was that a same-sex marriage license, together with the clergy person's status in a same-sex relationship, was a public declaration that the person is a self-avowed practicing homosexual. The Judicial Council decision found that an openly homosexual and partnered bishop may be charged with disobedience to church law. "Self-avowal does not nullify the consecration and cause removal from episcopal office but is a sufficient declaration to subject the bishop's ministerial office to review," the decision said. The council said it had no jurisdiction over the nomination, election and assignment of a bishop.

Bishop Jung will once again lead a weekend bus tour and retreat this summer, August 18-20. Opportunities include participating in a Shabbat service at Congregation Shalom in Milwaukee; visiting Sikh,



Islamic, and Hindu worship centers in and around Milwaukee; and worshipping at a Coptic Orthodox Church in Oak Creek. Participants will also have the opportunity to speak with a Buddhist priest, a Muslim professor, and Bishop Jung. ### **Register for 2017 Spiritual Formation Academy**



Do you long to be with others who share a desire to deepen one's relationship with God through teaching, prayer, daily Communion, and covenantal fellowship? The Wisconsin Five-Day Academy for Spiritual Formation is a place where Christian faith is challenged, all in the context of a shared experience led by faculty presenters,

who invite participants to reflect on your own spiritual journey, and how God is at work in your life. The Academy is for clergy and laity. It is designed for both "head" and "heart," communicating knowledge about Christian spiritual formation and a context for experiencing it. Registration is now open for this year's retreat, which will be held October 29 to November 3 at the Siena Retreat Center in Racine.

### **Annual Conference 2017**

The Wisconsin Annual Conference was June 16-19. Ask your lay delegates about the details following the briefings. The Conference budget was held steady for 2018 and no major legislation was passed. The conference changed the registration process for display tables and decided to continue the feasibility study for a capital campaign.

## NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

It has been a busy month—preparations for a week at Garrett including many hours of homework, a weekend at Annual Conference, graduation parties, and the normal business of summer. Things continue to grow and change around the churches and we're slowly catching all of the administrative squirrels. Maybe I'm just learning where to put the traps!

We are just about ready to put some finishing touches on the website and we now have online giving available for our members and guests! Both churches are in a position to serve the community. We been doing some little things recently, including a very cold and wet brat sale that still was able to provide support for the Kids' Ranch. We are planning to keep doing these ministries in partnership with other local organizations, but it is also time for us to do some of our own ministry.

I have been working with Pr. Procopio at Reedsburg as he tries to get a Hispanic ministry started here in the Dells. Both churches continue to welcome our guests and we are trying to make it easier for them to find us; it apparently works because I get a call at least every other week to confirm times and directions that people have read online. One thing is still missing; some of our neighbors.

The hardest thing to do is reach out to our neighbors. Possibly because they know us, likely because we think they have some ideas about us. Jesus even had trouble in His hometown because the people there did not have faith in Him. They heard about the miracles He was doing, they heard Him teach in their own churches, but they couldn't believe He was anything other than Joseph's son. The son of a carpenter who was from Galilee, but likely nothing more special than that.

But Jesus was more than that. His neighbors knew it but needed to believe it. They wanted to see miracles before they believed, and sometimes that is how it works with us as well. We want to see something that proves our neighbors are different; and they want to see it in us. But that is harder when they haven't been invited to walk with us. So we need to reach out, even if no one is willing to take our hand and walk along. I will be sharing with a number of people at Garrett, messages and convictions they don't want to hear, but some will. We need to do the same in any community... especially this community. Let your neighbors see and hear what we have to offer at these churches. Invite them to join us, to be blessed by the company of our family, and to meet our Savior.
